From Vicar Mia-

The Noisy offering for July, on Sunday, July 28th will be for the Duck Valley Indian Reservation

The Reservation was established on April 16, 1877, for the Western Shoshone and Northern Paiute people. It is approximately 2 hours from Mountain Home and 2 hours from Elko. Duck Valley has one town which is Owyhee, located across the border in Nevada, the reservation population is approximately 1265 people. The Duck Valley Reservation is 20 miles long and 17 miles wide, and all land is tribal owned. The majority of the land is used for grazing cattle and horses. The primary jobs are created by ranching, fishing/hunting, agriculture, Tribal Government and the Indian Health Services. The school district is the Owyhee School District and it is made up of one elementary school and one junior high/senior high school. Duck Valley has one convenience/grocery store but it is not really a grocery store but there is a gas station that is attached, so the residents of Duck Valley need to travel 2 hours to a real grocery store or a department store.



August's Noisy Offering on Sunday, August 25th is for the The Shoe That Grows. One day while out walking with the kids, Kenton Lee noticed that the little girl in a white dress next to

him had shoes that were way too small for her feet. That led to an idea: "What if there was a shoe that could adjust and expand—so kids always had a pair of shoes that fit?" After returning home to the United States Kenton pitched his concept of a "shoe that grows" to several different shoe companies. Even though none of them were interested, Kenton still continued to believe in his vision. His next step was to assemble a small team, and together they began to build many different prototypes. Finally, after 5 years of hard work and experimentation, his idea had become reality. **The Shoe That Grows was born!**

Thanks for your continued support. 8/25 **The Shoe That Grows** has adjustable points at the front, sides and the back of the sandal to help it expand. Kenton Lee, from Nampa, Idaho, came up with the idea while working in Nairobi in Kenya after seeing children running around barefoot and in shoes several sizes too small. Mr. Lee is working with an organization called Because International which aims to send the shoes to orphanages in Africa. They are hoping that other charities and health workers will take shoes out with them when they visit areas to hand out to children. A single pair costs \$30 but buying 100 pairs reduces the cost to \$12. Mission Aviation Fellowship often takes packs of shoes with them when they are delivering medical supplies. Thanks for helping to improve a child's life.

Monthly Food Collections: July 28 Luke 11: 1-3 Daily Bread - Bring grain foods such as cereals, rice and pasta. Thanks for helping to stock our food pantry.

GARDEN NEWS: Sheila Anderson

We are working at Trinity Wednesday and Saturday mornings starting at 8 am.

We have been digging out the old wood chips composted and replacing them. At Trinity we are up to 131 pounds of produce as of 7/12/19.

In June the SILD crew came out and helped in the garden. We got weeding caught up, planted two beds of carrots and painted the shed to match the church. We also harvested 16 pounds of cabbage. They were done by 11:30. After lunch they went out to CS and helped weed there.

At the Canyon Springs site we are working Monday and Thursday mornings starting at 8 am. At CS we are up to 48 pounds of produce as of 7/12/19.

June 17 about 40 young adults from the Middleton LDS church came to CS and helped build a small door for the shed and do other maintenance. We are solarizing half of the garden at CS to kill the weeds.

GOSPEL AND GROWTH: Tami Robinson

We met on July 2, 2019 for our regular monthly meeting.

Trinity hosted a booth at the Flying M Seasonal Farmer's Market on June 27th from 6:00 to 8:00 pm. We had a lot of

information about some of the projects that Trinity is involved with. Sheila gave away flower seeds with a spin on the "Wheel of Fortune" wheel. We had some people sign up to volunteer in the gardens. We had a lot of parents who were interested in the Peace Camp. A few took flyers about the Life Tree Café and information about our canning class in September. Mia promoted the "Conversations about Food Justice and Spirituality" and we had eight people join in the first discussion on July 2nd. There was a craft that children and/or adults could paint a puzzle piece pin or magnet to describe what their place is in the puzzle of life concerning food (gardener, eater, consumer, distributor, farmer, processor, etc.)! We felt it was a worthwhile event and will discuss doing it again if we can find a day to schedule it!

We again discussed our support commitment for the films during Pastor's Sabbatical and finalized our individual tasks.

We are going to do some doorhangers to promote the August 17, 2019 Block Party and Rally Sunday. We will work on those at our next meeting.

Stewardship of Our Faith Stories - It feels like it's all about stories in late July, doesn't it?!? All

of our families have wonderful, and often amusing, stories to tell.....like when we got lost in a corn maze or Mom & Dad forgot to come pick us up from camp. The year-round-stewardship emphasis for August relates to our "faith stories". Now before you cringe and run in the opposite direction, let's get something straight. For a few of you, your biggest faith story might be a classic "born again" story about the first time Jesus became real and personal for you. But for many of you, particularly those baptized as infants and raised with weekly Sunday School, the stories you tell about your faith might be quite different. "It's Not Your Grandmother's Canning Anymore"



"What does that mean?", you ask. We all have memories of our mothers and grandmothers preserving jars and jars of fruits and vegetables to feed their families during the winter months. My mom learned to can from her mom because they had 15 children and had a huge garden to provide for them. Many of us learned from them how to can and often use the recipes handed down, handwritten on scraps of paper. When Trinity started the canning class it was to help beginners learn to make the most of their garden surplus at harvest time. We have a group of Master Food Safety Advisors here at Trinity, trained and certified by the University of Idaho Ada County Extension Office educators. Over the last few years we have changed the focus to teach people the changes that have come from the latest research about food safety regarding home food preservation. Home canning gives you the opportunity to preserve food without the additives that you find in retail food on the shelf. But if you don't preserve it properly you may be endangering your loves ones. I have extensive training in food safety but learned that I didn't know much about home preservation. We have our fall canning class on September 7, 2019 from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm, here at Trinity. Come join Lloyd & Judy Kellar, Ruthann Sutton, Tami Robinson, Diane Helton, and other advisors as we show you the ropes. We will also have educators from the Ada County Extension Office present. If you have any questions just talk to one of us. More information about registration will be coming soon!
