Dear Friends in Christ,

In May, we are lifting up ministry in daily life. In truth, this is what we do all year long. There are many quotes out there on the internet attributed to Martin Luther on vocation and calling. Here is something we know Luther said about work, whether the work of the prince or the work of the laborer: "The prince should think: Christ has served me and made everything to follow him; therefore, I should also serve my neighbor, protect him and everything that belongs to him. That is why God has given me this office, and I have it that I might serve him. That would be a good prince and ruler. When a prince sees a neighbor his neighbor oppressed, he should think: That concerns me! I must protect and shield my neighbor...The same is true for shoemaker, tailor, scribe, or reader. If he is a Christian tailor, he will say: I make these clothes because God has bidden me do so, so that I can earn a living, so that I can help and serve my neighbor. (*Sermon in the Castle Church at Weimar*).

There was a time when my father was not a camp director or the head of camping for the American Lutheran Church (ALC, a predecessor to the ELCA). During that time he wrote a newsletter for the ALC called *Salt and Light* (based on Matt. 5:13-15 where Jesus tells the crowds that they are salt and light). The language used around the evening dinner table, because of my father's work, was *Discipleship in Society*. I still love that phrase because it names so clearly that the way we care for one another out in society (workplace, nonprofit agencies, schools, playgrounds, recreation) is as important as anything we do inside the walls of our sanctuary or church building. On Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday we asked you to name some of the ways you live out discipleship in society. In May we will share back with you some of what we received in written form. I am looking forward to lifting up and celebrating the many ways our members and friends are already salt and light for the community and world. Peace, Pastor Meggan

April's Noisy Offering on Sunday, April 28th will be for *Learning Peace, A Camp for Kids*. Learning Peace is a summer day camp here in Nampa for children ages 6-13. Children learn practical tools to make them active peacemakers. They learn about peace within quietness and physical movement; they cultivate joy through music; they deepen self-expression through art. Children learn about peace with other people through conflict resolution, interpreting media, and non-competitive play. They learn about peace with other kinds of people from different cultural backgrounds. Children learn to connect with nature while being outside, taking hikes, and participating in cooperative, team-building activities. Peace Camp coordinator, Deacon Diane McGeoch will be with us in worship April 28th.



The Noisy offering for May, on Sunday, May 26th will be for *Sleep in Heavenly Peace- bunk beds*.

All children deserve a safe, comfortable place to lay their heads. In Idaho and across the US, too many boys and girls go without a bed—or even a pillow—to sleep on. These children end up sleeping on couches, blankets, and even floors. This can affect their happiness and their health. That's where Sleep in Heavenly Peace comes in. We're a group of volunteers dedicated to building, assembling and delivering top-notch bunk beds to children and families in need. Our organization has grown steadily over time, and we're working on opening more chapters in different states to serve more people. If a child needs a bed, we want to make sure they get one. **No kid sleeps on the floor in our town.**

Highlights of Congregation Council Meeting for April Team Reports for 4/11/19

PASTOR'S REPORT: Pr. Meggan Manlove

Lent and Holy Week - I have been so pleased with the leadership and reception of both our new midweek evening prayer service "Joyous Light" and the service of healing we have included this Lent. Thanks to everyone who has attended. I am really looking forward to our Living our Baptism Retreat April 5-6. Holy Week should include meaningful worship services and it will be wonderful to welcome new members Easter Sunday.

Cluster/Synod - Prayers for St. Paul, Ontario as they interview for a new pastor. Prayers of thanksgiving for King of Glory as they welcome their interim pastor from the Rocky Mountain Synod. Everyone is welcome to closing worship for Synod Assembly, May 19 at the Riverside Hotel, Boise. Members from our Companion Synod in Tanzania will help lead worship.

VICAR REPORT: Vicar Mia Crosthwaite

YOUTH AND CHRISTIAN EDUCATION: Mary Braudrick

This team met the evening of February 27, 2019 in Pastor Meggan's office.

The Youth Retreat (with Shepherd of the Valley youth) in Garden Valley was rescheduled due to snow. The new date is March 29th-31st.

The children's worship bulletins were discussed and reviewed. Also discussed were activity bags for the younger kids to use during worship time. Joyce will donate bags already made by the TLC crafting group, and the bags will be filled with crayons and things to color, small toys, etc. from the dollar store.

After extended discussion, the team decided that Luther Heights "Camperships" will be paid 100% for ANY child that wants to go to camp. Financing was reviewed (the profits from Trivia night, plus other donors) and camper kids were counted, & it was clear that this could be done. If a camper desires to do an extra activity (i.e. horseback riding, etc.) that would be at the individual's expense. Distributing camperships in this way will hopefully increase the LH Camp experience for more kids.

Trinity's \$500.00 College scholarship for 2019 has no applicants at this time.

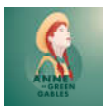

"FIX THE ROOF" - Through the children's messages and dramas, and through the words of various hymns in March, you have been reminded of the importance of keeping our building in good shape. Our east wing houses offices for Trinity New Hope, Learning

Peace Camp, plus our own pastor, vicar and office administrator. It has classrooms for all ages, where we hold Sunday School, Adult Forum, the Monday class, plus church committee meetings. And we host learning space for the community, including International Rescue Committee's US Citizenship exam classes, Al-Anon (support group for relatives of those dealing with addiction), Dream Weavers Theater, After The Harvest canning classes, Red Cross Blood Drives, Gardening Classes, Math Tutoring, and many more. It is a place for fellowship, serving our members, the Hispanic Apostolic Church, Trinity New Hope families, and others from the community. All these activities are negatively impacted by our leaky roof, and the solution is, as Karson says, "**FIX THE ROOF!**" This will be an expensive undertaking, and we know we will need to get a loan to cover part of the cost. But it would be great to have that loan be as small as possible. So be watching for upcoming fundraisers to help defray the amount of that loan - - and be thinking about how you might be led to financially support the roof project.
