Dear Friends in Christ,

This Easter Season we are making our way through the letter of First John. The letter contains such iconic lines as these: "If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he who is faithful and just will forgive our sins and cleans us from all unrighteousness" (1:8-9), "Little children, let us love, not in word or speech, but in truth and action" (3:18), "Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God; everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. Whoever does not love does not know God, for God is love" (4:7-8). The letter is all about connecting our faith in God with our actual lives. Is that not what we are always trying to do as followers of Jesus, as members of the Body of Christ? Of course, what this looks like changes and adapts to each new generation of disciples, our own included. And other New Testament writers talk about how each one of us is equipped uniquely and has our own calling. But there are some basics to which we all are called to subscribe. Love is at the core of who God is. Likewise, love must guide the life of those who follow Jesus, those who live in the light of God. Who precisely is this love to be directed towards? In Mark 12:29-31 Jesus answered a scribe's question about the greatest commandment. I interpret Jesus' answer to mean that I am to love God, my neighbor, and myself. Depending on how we grew up, our current circumstances, what is going on in the world, we might have trouble with one or more of those different loves, but all three are important. We will not always love or put our love into actions as we should. The first quote above from First John is a confession, telling the truth about when we are not faithful and not loving. Confession too, is part of love. It tells our neighbor that we know we have fallen short, and we see it. Confession is the first step in real reconciliation. Confession is also part of reconciling with God. Confession and forgiveness, action, and love are all related and they are all woven throughout this beautiful letter from the early church. Lots of things in life change but some things remain the same. I am glad to be following Jesus alongside you all this Easter Season.

April's Noisy Offering on Sunday, April 25th will be for **The Nampa Bicycle Project**. The MISSION of *The Nampa Bicycle Project* is to provide bicycles to persons in need of transportation and inexpensive recreation. Sometimes all a person needs is a way to get from point A to point B. To get to a job interview, a job, to keep a critical appointment, shop for necessities, or just visit friends or family. When it costs \$6,000/year to own and maintain a car and public transportation is limited to daytime hours Monday through Friday or when mom and dad don't have anything extra for a good bicycle, it can be tough. A bicycle can mean the difference between someone feeling stuck and feeling free. The difference between feeling left out or being a regular part of the community. So many bicycles end up in dumpsters every day. We thought it was time to stop putting them in a land fill and start putting them in the hands of people who could use them. It means some volunteer time but it also gives us a chance to provide a small safe place for people to connect and a way to offer hope on 2 wheels.



The Noisy offering for **May**, on Sunday, May 30th will be for **The Treasure Valley Community Resource Center** (TVCRC). The TVCRC is a comprehensive telephone referral service putting people needing help in touch with those who can help them. Proudly marking 29 years of service in April of 2021, Treasure Valley Community Resource Center remains the only agency of its kind serving Southwest Idaho and continues to offer "The Human Touch in One Stop Referral Service"

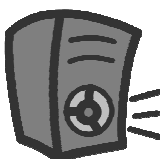
FLOWERS! Thanks to all who have contributed flowers for our YouTube and Facebook services. We will be doing Easter lilies for Easter Sunday

Team Reports for 4/15/21

PASTOR'S REPORT: Pr. Megan Manlove

Holy Week: Grateful for everyone who had a part in Palm Sunday on patio with guest speaker and door prizes, Easter Egg and Basket Decorating with families (baskets delivered to 11 of our senior households!), Maundy Thursday - first in-person indoors, Good Friday Stations of the Cross self-guided meditation, Easter prerecorded and in-person worship services. Thanks also to everyone who came for clean-up day before Holy Week began.

Partnerships: Paulette and I have fostered a new partnership between the Garden and West Middle School's 21st Century Club. Youth and staff helped in the garden after school March 30 and that will continue through the spring. The same LDS crew (though this time a bigger group) who helped install new garden beds last spring is going to paint doors and trim at Trinity New Hope Saturday, May 8.

Community: I participated in a conversation about affordable housing at Nampa City Hall April 5 and led the opening prayer that evening at the city council meeting. I continue to help with the Traveling Table monthly food distribution in North Central Nampa. I'm going to be on a zoom panel about community gardens in May, hosted by Lutherans Restoring Creation.

COVID Task Force: We have our protocols in place for indoors in-person worship and Maundy Thursday was our first attempt implementing. Starting in May, we will have once a month indoors in-person worship (35 people), along with our outdoor in-person worship.

Our mission is to reduce waste by recycling bicycles and supplying them to persons in need of transportation, health, or inexpensive recreation and to advocate for bicycling and walking in the City of Nampa. **5/30 Treasure Valley Community Resources Center, Inc.** was established in Caldwell in 1992. TVCRC serves all of Southwest Idaho by providing a vital link between those in need and the many human service agencies developed to assist them. Information about their needs is gathered from a caller. Then the client is referred to all social services for which they are qualified. They are provided with the phone number and name of a contact person and are also informed about special requirements or documents they might need. TVCRC trained volunteers focus on using the **human touch** to assist each client in a caring, friendly, effective manner with up-to-date information and the experience to guide the client through the maze of human services. Due to

the pandemic TVCRC is desperately in need of funding. Please give your support to such a worthy cause as you are able.

GOSPEL & GROWTH (part 1) – Penelope Smith finalized plans for S'wine Swap on 4/22, including a short video to explain this social event celebrating God's Global Barnyard. In addition to people bringing items to swap (things related to barnyard animals or local agriculture), there will be an "Everyone Wins" table with plant starts, some items available for an extra donation to world hunger, and a Barnyard Bingo

trivia game with prizes. The campaign concludes on 5/23 (Pentecost Sunday). People are asked to label their decorated/filled barnyard boxes and bring with them to outdoor in-person church. Goats (our highlighted animal) will make an appearance, including through prizes. Watch for Easter Season bookmarks in the May congregational mailing. And plan to attend the church campout July 30 - August 1 in Donnelley.

GOSPEL & GROWTH (part 2)– Tami Robinson

We met on April 7, 2021. We discussed a devotion that Penelope shared about "grieving what's lost but embracing what is the same, but different". For instance we can't gather in person for coffee hour but we are spending time with people on Zoom that we might not have come to know at coffee hour. Our discussion was followed by prayer.

We reviewed the Global Barnyard activities that have happened so far and feel that the feedback has been positive. On Palm Sunday we celebrated the bees that play such a big part in the agricultural community. April 22nd is our next activity and will be held on the lawn at Trinity. This is the S'wine Swap. Everyone is encouraged to bring something to "swap" for something else. We are focusing on the pigs in the barnyard and would like items that are tied to local agriculture, such as wine. Hence the s'wine in the title. There are lots of local products to choose from or we can make or bake something.

May 23rd, on Pentecost we will conclude the God's Global Barnyard fundraiser and will focus on goats on that day.

Besides the "swap", we'll have time to relax and catch up with each other, and play some Barnyard Bingo. Perhaps you'll win a prize, like a bacon-motif face mask!
