## July 2021



Dear Friends in Christ,

This summer we are making our way through Mark's gospel and First and Second Samuel. We will continue to read the Psalm, always a response to the Old Testament lesson, and occasionally the assigned reading from the epistles or letters. Why are Mark's gospel and the books of First and Second Samuel paired and what in the world does that have to do with life in 2021? You might remember that back in Advent, the church season before Christmas, Jesus' forerunner John the Baptist came on the scene proclaiming that "the kingdom of God has come near." There were no shepherds, no wise men from the East, just this prophet. Jesus quickly took up the same message, really embodying it in everything he did. The message is clear—the reign of God has come near. It is equally clear that Jesus' idea of kingship is going to be other-worldly or counter-cultural. This is significant because "kingdom" was a big part of his people's history. The stories of the monarchies (including David and Solomon) were important in the Israelites' history and memory. Gail Ramshaw writes, "since Mark describes Christ as the hidden Messiah (that is, the *Anointed One*), the court histories that tell of the anointed kinds of Israel are heard in Year B" (2021-22). And so, this summer we might ask, what can we learn from reading about the anointed kings of Israel? Watching the people and the kings, what can we learn about both what we want and what we need in leaders? Is the king always the leader? Pay attention to the other characters in the stories from First and Second Samuel. What can we learn from them about faithfulness and leadership? Jesus is ushering in a new reign or kingdom. What is at its core and how can we join the movement?

**June's** Noisy Offering on Sunday, June 27th will be for ***The Shoe that Grows***. In 2007, Kenton Lee was ready to leave Nampa, Idaho to see the world. He had just graduated from local college Northwest

Nazarene University and hoped to learn about places outside of his hometown. So Kenton lived in Ecuador for six months and then in Kenya for six months. While in Kenya, Kenton lived and volunteered at an orphanage about an hour outside of the capital Nairobi. On a hot day a couple of weeks into his stay, Kenton was walking down a dusty road to church with some of the children. "there's a little girl next to me. She has on this beautiful white dress, and she's probably eight or nine years old. As I looked down at her I remember just being shocked at how small her shoes were. They were so small she had to cut open the front to let her toes stick out". This image stuck with Kenton. Were all of the children in the orphanage wearing shoes that didn't fit? He asked the director of the orphanage who told Kenton that they had received a big donation of shoes and clothes the year before, but as kids grow rapidly, the orphanage did not have the funds to continually buy new items. After returning home Kenton pitched his concept of a "shoe that grows" to several different shoe companies. Even though none of them were interested, Kenton still continued to believe in his vision. His next step was to assemble a small team, and together they began to build many different prototypes. Finally, after 5 years of hard work and experimentation, his idea had become reality. There the idea for The Shoe That Grows and Because International was born.



The Noisy offering for **July**, on Sunday, July 25th will be for ***The Duck Valley Indian Reservation***. The Reservation was established on April 16, 1877, for the Western Shoshone and Northern Paiute people. It is approximately 2 hours from Mountain Home and 2 hours from Elko. Duck Valley has one town which is Owyhee, located across the border in Nevada, the reservation population is approximately 1265 people. The Duck Valley Reservation is 20 miles long and 17 miles wide, and all land is tribal owned. The majority of the land is used for grazing cattle and horses. The primary jobs are created by ranching, fishing/hunting, agriculture, Tribal Government and the Indian Health Services. The school district is the Owyhee School District and it is made up of one elementary school and one junior high/senior high school. Duck Valley has one convenience/grocery store but it is not really a grocery store but there is a gas station that is attached, so the residents of Duck Valley need to travel 2 hours to a real grocery store or a department store.

One parishioner used one of our new hearing-impaired devices for the first time June 6--wonderful! Six youth attended our Interest Meeting for the 2022 ELCA Youth Gathering. Morning Study Group (Mondays) will soon start an eight-week Bible Study on 1 and 2 Samuel, our summer Old Testament lesson texts. Thanks to those restarting the monthly Women's Luncheon.

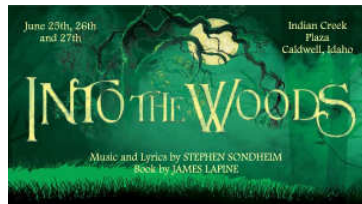
"Cultivating Shalom" - is July's Year-Round Stewardship theme. We want to alert you to activities where you can grow your relationships with people from other

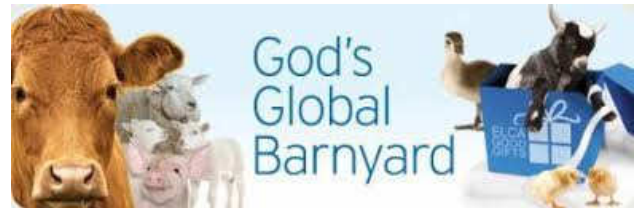
