We also continue to offer worship online—also life-giving for people from many walks of life. The timing of being able to gather in person coincides with many of you hitting the road to see family and friends far away or explore the beauty of the natural world right here in the Mountain West. Another part of our current reality are the many members who put in multiple hours thinking, pivoting, learning, making decisions, and serving. Many faithful volunteers are now weary and worn and need some serious sabbath time before the fall. What this means is, if we are not full speed (whatever that means) until September, there are good reasons and most of those reasons have to do with rest and healing after a hard chapter of individual and communal life.

The Noisy Offering for **July**, on Sunday, July 25th will be for **The Duck Valley Indian Reservation**. The Reservation was established on April 16, 1877, for the Western Shoshone and Northern Paiute people. It is approximately 2 hours from Mountain Home and 2 hours from Elko. Duck Valley has one town which is Owyhee, located across the border in Nevada, the reservation population is approximately 1265 people. The Duck Valley Reservation is 20 miles long and 17 miles wide, and all land is tribal owned. The majority of the land is used for grazing cattle and horses. The primary jobs are created by ranching, fishing/hunting, agriculture, Tribal Government and the Indian Health Services. The school district is the Owyhee School District and it is made up of one elementary school and one junior high/senior high school. Duck Valley has one convenience/grocery store but it is not really a grocery store but there is a gas station that is attached, so the residents of Duck Valley need to travel 2 hours to a real grocery store or a department store.



August's Noisy Offering on Sunday, August 29th will be for *The House Next Door*. The MISSION of *The House Next Door* is to accompany and assist single mothers and their children as the mothers pursue appropriate educational degrees, in part, by providing rent-free housing. It is our goal to help young women become successful and self-sufficient, thereby improving the quality of life for themselves, their children, and the community.



Worship Plan for **August 1st**: The weekend of the church campout (Jul 30-Aug. 1) there will be no in-person worship in the sanctuary. We hope to record Saturday worship at the campout and have it available Sunday morning on YouTube. Team Reports for 7/15/21

PASTOR'S REPORT: Pr. Meggan Manlove

Cluster – Redeemer and Immanuel both have their Mission and Life (pre-call committee) teams assembled. We are going to continue our cluster conversation (begun at the leadership retreat this spring) in September/October with a local consultant.

Partnerships—Registrations are up for Learning Peace: A Camp for Kids. This team started meeting weekly at the end of June. Thanks in advance to all of our volunteers.

Pastoral Care – I resumed in person Home Communion with people who feel comfortable with an in person visit and will continue when I return from vacation. Teams of volunteers are resuming visits as well.

Pastoral Acts – Presided at Juvi and Drew Masumbuko's wedding June 19 at Cathedral of the Rockies, Boise.

GOSPEL AND GROWTH: The immediate focus is on the Church CampOut at Donnelly July 30 - August 1. At present, 10 households are expected for a weekend that will include 4 potluck food events, fellowship time, and Saturday evening worship that will be later posted to YouTube and Facebook. We began planning for an open-sanctuary evening on September 29th designed to help us mourn what has been lost, particularly during the past 18 months. This will be a time of remembrance of loved ones who have died (people and pets), those who have moved away, and relationships that now feel irretrievably broken. In addition, we started work on the 2021 Advent Daily Devotional booklet, and are asking all potential authors (both veteran and first-timers) to start thinking about their entries.

STEWARDSHIP: meets 7/13, working primarily on the Fall Financial Campaign. Additional time & talent sheets were mailed out in June; we now have received 50 completed forms.

while you are there for worship or a meeting. We can absolutely send a form to you by email. We hope for church life to ramp up in the fall, but it takes the combined effort of all of us to make that a reality.

Working Towards Accessibility



At Trinity, we are committed to making sure that all are welcome. This includes making sure that we address barriers

that may hinder the worship experience as well as service and fellowship experiences. Current members and friends of Trinity have inherited a relatively accessible building thanks to architects and church leadership. Our facility has no stairs, and most spaces have wide double-door entryways. In the past few years, we have completed the following steps towards greater accessibility:

- created an accessible family bathroom,
- added more handicap parking spaces,
- rearranged furniture in the sanctuary to make space for wheelchairs,
- and purchased hearing devices (if you worship with us and need a hearing device, please speak with an usher)

Trinity has been doing this for about 10 years. Many organizations support school supply drives that help Treasure Valley school children, but Trinity supports Duck Valley because of their isolated location, the high poverty rate of the reservation and the economic supports are not available to the school children of Duck Valley like the school children of the Treasure Valley. Duck Valley families have two options to get their school supplies. Shop at the town of Owyhee's convenience store (higher prices) or drive 100 miles in either direction to the nearest bigger towns (plus add in the price of gas). You can support July's Noisy Offering by either donating \$\$ or shopping yourself (watch for sales). Put supplies in the boxes in the narthex. **All items need to be received no later than Sunday, August 8th** so supplies can be taken to the reservation. If you want to shop. The needed items are- backpacks (girls and boys of all ages), notebooks/composition notebooks, packs of paper, glue bottles/glue sticks, highlighters, student scissors, rulers, pens, pencils, erasers, pencil boxes, scientific calculators, crayons, colored pencils, folders, 3 ring binders. Our Losses - Each of us has experienced loss during the past several years. Loved ones, friends and neighbors have died. People have moved away. Relationships

between those who view medical, social and political issues from radically different perspectives have become strained or fractured. We do so miss those people (and pets)! The pandemic has inhibited our access to that which brings comfort as we work through our grief. Funerals have been delayed or confined to immediate family. COVID has prevented us from giving/receiving hugs, touching shoulders, and holding hands. It feels like our grief has been locked away.

Trinity will host an evening when we can name our losses and move through our grief. You are invited to (in advance) provide us with names of those you have lost to death or moving, and, if possible, photographs and/or small objects that remind you of those individuals. We will have these displayed on tables in the sanctuary, which will be open for two hours, with gentle music in the background. At 7:00 pm, there will be a brief service of remembrance. We encourage you to participate in whatever way best fits your needs and personality. You may wish to view the displays, then sit quietly in a pew. You may wish to be present for the service at 7pm, coming early or staying late. You may wish to experience this very privately - **OR** - take advantage of the presence of your faith community. It's up to you.
