Dear Friends in Christ,

Outside of Holy Week, there is no part of the church year with more variety of riches and rituals than the month of November. We begin with All Saints Sunday, celebrating the baptized people of God, living and dead, who are the body of Christ. At Trinity we name aloud individuals who have died since last All Saints Sunday. The month continues with Christ the King Sunday/Reign of Christ, a day on which we remember that our first allegiance is to Jesus Christ, king of kings, but a king who was born in a barn and wore a crown of thorns. This year we are again having an expanded Advent, beginning on All Saints Sunday. The blue paraments and wreath will not come out until Nov. 28, but you will see royal blue, the color of Advent, in the sanctuary earlier in the month. We will learn a new Advent hymn beginning Nov. 7. Advent themes of waiting, expectation, and hope will appear in the prayers, scripture readings and sermons. I will also lead three noon discussions on Zoom about the Advent conspiracy in November (see more inside the Epistle). We hope these conversations and lifting up the tenets of the Advent Conspiracy (worship fully, spend less, give more, love all) in other ways will enrich your expanded Advent beyond the walls of Trinity Lutheran Church. Scholarship Description and
Application 2021 Graduates**

The Trinity Lutheran Church College Scholarship is for graduating high school seniors who are active+ members of Trinity Lutheran Church in Nampa, Idaho. This scholarship must be used at a two-year or four-year accredited college or university or an accredited trade school within the academic year following their high school graduation. It is to be used for tuition, books or other education related fees. This scholarship is supported by the Trinity Lutheran Church (TLC) congregation and the TLC Youth Program. The monetary value* funded by TLC for this scholarship will total \$500. This will be given out or divided between one or more students recommended to the church council by the youth committee for final approval based on their Trinity Lutheran Church College Scholarship Application. Scholarship applications will be available to download on the TLC website-www.nampatrinity.org Applicants must complete the application form and return it to the church office before February 15 of their graduating year. Criteria for award selection will be based on completed application and 2 letters of recommendation. Applicants will be notified by mail in April if they are to receive the award [whole or partial]. Recipients will be recognized at the High School Graduate Recognition Sunday in May.

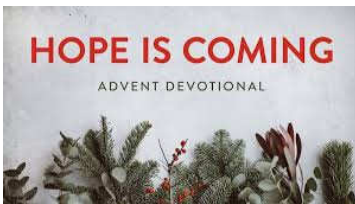

Was it a set of values.....or the feeling that "somehow you could do it" because you were made of strong stuff, just like a parent or grandparent? Was it a spiritual legacy, an understanding that you are so very important to God conveyed to you in the words and actions of a special person? Our current **Year-Round Stewardship** theme

of **LEGACY** challenges us to answer these questions, but to also ponder what legacy WE might give to others, including through financial planning. All Saints' Day
