Dear Friends in Christ,

If you could have overheard me talking about Advent and Christmas during the last few months, you would have heard a refrain with these words: love, peace, joy, and hope. We live in an imperfect world and there continues to be pain and suffering in our personal lives, in our community, and across the globe. And, as we acknowledged on Reign of Christ Sunday, the reign of God is breaking in. God did in fact come and dwell among us in Jesus and Jesus will come again. In this in-between time, we wait in hope, and we see glimpses of the kingdom of God. One of the things I love about the church year is that different seasons lend themselves to different emphases of our faith. Advent and Christmas together are great seasons for those four words I have been repeating. So, join us Dec. 12 as youth and adults present the annual Christmas program and then join us after worship to decorate cookies and pack up gift bags for Trinity New Hope residents. Join us for Holden Evening Prayer, preceded by a simple meal of soup and bread, on Wednesdays, Dec. 1, 8, and 15. On Tuesday, Dec. 21 we will be outside for a brief Longest Night liturgy and a campfire. We will have two Christmas Eve Services (4PM and 10PM). Those are the two services we need you to SIGN UP for (see the end of this Epistle for the links). We have two Sundays in Christmas this year, including Jan. 2 when we will host our traditional Readings and Carols service. The sanctuary will be open from 5-7PM on Epiphany, Jan. 6. Come pick up your star word, light a candle for someone or some place, and hang your 2022 intentions/hopes on our tree. Throughout the Advent and Christmas Seasons, notice the moments in your daily life when love, peace, joy, and hope are manifest. 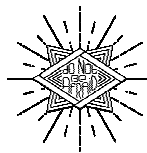

The Trinity Lutheran Church College Scholarship is for graduating high school seniors who are active+ members of Trinity Lutheran Church in Nampa, Idaho. This scholarship must be used at a two-year or four-year accredited college or university or an accredited trade school within the academic year following their high school graduation. It is to be used for tuition, books or other education related fees. This scholarship is supported by the Trinity Lutheran Church (TLC) congregation and the TLC Youth Program. The monetary value* funded by TLC for this scholarship will total \$500. This will be given out or divided between one or more students recommended to the church council by the youth committee for final approval based on their Trinity Lutheran Church College Scholarship Application. Scholarship applications will be available to download on the TLC website- www.nampatrinity.org Applicants must complete the application form and return it to the church office before February 15 of their graduating year. Criteria for award selection will be based on completed application and 2 letters of recommendation. Applicants will be notified by mail in April if they are to receive the award [whole or partial]. Recipients will be recognized at the High School Graduate Recognition Sunday in May.

GOSPEL AND GROWTH: Penelope Smith meets this week. Covers and pages of the Advent Daily Devotional booklet have been printed; these will be assembled, ready for distribution starting November 21st. There is the standard format, plus large print and a version that can be shared by email, allowing people to send to friends/family and read on computer or laptop. The video of September's Remember and Grieve Together has been watched nearly 60 times. \$775 was requested for the 2022 budget

STEWARDSHIP: Penelope Smith meets this week. 38 households have returned 2022 pledge cards, with a total of \$100,820.00 pledged thus far. The celebration video was watched 49 times and was shown in the Koinonia Room after church on several Sundays. Only 6 households have requested small colored offering envelopes, with 4 declining and another 13 households (who used envelopes in 2021) not responding; phone calls will be made. \$685 was requested for the 2022 budget. The current Year-Round Stewardship theme is Stewarding Advent, using Advent Conspiracy activities. In December we will focus on Stewardship of Our Inner Calm.



Poinsettias

One of Trinity's Christmas traditions is to provide poinsettias for Christmas Worship. There will be a tear-off in the December *Epistle* and in our bulletins.

All you have to do is purchase the poinsettia of your choice and bring it to church by **December 20th**. You'll be able to designate it in honor of someone living or in memory of someone who has died.



Stewardship of Our Inner Calm is the year-round stewardship theme for December, a month that is infamous for its stress. Each week during Advent, we will highlight ways of

using one of our five senses to take brief "calm breaks". Starting November 28th, we will feature the sense of hearing: what sounds can you listen to that are sure to put you in a peaceful state of mind? The week of December 7th focuses on the sense of sight: what can you gaze upon that transports you to a place of calm? Next, starting December 14th, is the sense of taste: what seasonal (or other) foods and beverages have the power to bring serenity to your world, if only for a few moments at a time? Finally, from December 21st forward, we will feature the senses of smell and touch: what aromas and textures work for you? Look for our prompts on the church Facebook page and for table-tents at our Wednesday Soup Suppers. And treat yourself to lots of little breaks, using whichever sense works best for you.
