This year we get two Sundays in the Christmas Season, two Sundays to dwell on the miracle of the incarnation, God come to dwell among us in the person of Jesus.

Christmas gifts and decorations have filled stores since at least mid-fall, but it will all be gone soon, too soon in my humble opinion. When Christmas final comes, can we not enjoy it for the short but actual Christmas Season? Christmas lasts a full twelve days--all the way through Jan. 5 so make the most of the season. Team Reports for 12/14/21

PASTOR'S REPORT: Pr. Meggan Manlove

Cluster: Dec. 4 around 20 people from five congregations gathered at Hope Lutheran with facilitator Alicia Griffith. She led us through a four-hour Action Planning Session. At the end of the morning, we had broken into planning groups around five different items. Alicia will continue to coach/guide us through June 2022. Please talk to Trinity participants Sandy Blom, Sarah Henthorn, Penelope Smith, or Pastor Meggan if you want to hear more about the process and where we are headed.

Experimentation: I am excited for our first Longest Night outdoor worship Dec. 21 and to do Epiphany Stations for a second year Jan. 6. Thanks to a Thrivent Action Team we can purchase books for many of our families with kids and have an online Zoom discussion group in January about building faith practices in the homes.

Camp and Synod: Luther Heights Director Kelly Preboski will be with us at Trinity Jan. 30. In place of synod assembly this year, we will have three Regional Gatherings. The closest one to us will be in Twin Falls Saturday, May 14. Our speaker will be Linda Staats. Cost is \$300 per congregation and \$10 for each person. Our cluster may charter a bus.

In addition, many are reading the devotion on their computers and/or listening to Pastor Meggan read the devotions on Facebook. The committee delayed making a decision on Monday Midwinter Movies, waiting to see how the COVID numbers develop in December and early January.

STEWARDSHIP: Penelope Smith

is not meeting in December. Advent Conspiracy activities were done in November/December, including discussions on Zoom and at Adult Forum on some Advent questions, handing out activity packets to households with children, and placing the "bingo game" as the first page in the Advent Daily Devotional booklet. December Year-Round-Stewardship relates to Inner Calm, with prompts in each Sunday bulletin and as table tents at Soup Suppers. 38 pledge cards for 2022 have been received, with a revised total pledged of \$101,020.00. 12 households requested small colored offering envelopes for 2022; this compares with 24 households using envelopes in recent years. Most people who said "no" to envelopes going forward cited liking the return envelopes sent out

in the church's monthly mailings. 2022 envelope packets have been assembled and placed in church mailboxes. Those not picked up will be delivered between Christmas and New Years.

Description and Application
2021 Graduates**

The Trinity Lutheran Church College Scholarship is for graduating high school seniors who are active+ members of Trinity Lutheran Church in Nampa, Idaho. This scholarship must be used at a two-year or four-year accredited college or university or an accredited trade school within the academic year following their high school graduation. It is to be used for tuition, books or other education related fees. This scholarship is supported by the Trinity Lutheran Church (TLC) congregation and the TLC Youth Program. The monetary value* funded by TLC for this scholarship will total \$500. This will be given out or divided between one or more students recommended to the church council by the youth committee for final approval based on their Trinity Lutheran Church College Scholarship Application. Scholarship applications will be available to download on the TLC website- www.nampatrinity.org Applicants must complete the application form and return it to the church office before February 15 of their graduating year. Criteria for award selection will be based on completed application and 2 letters of recommendation. Applicants will be notified by mail in April if they are to receive the award [whole or partial]. Recipients will be recognized at the High School Graduate Recognition Sunday in May.

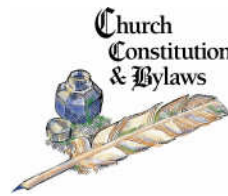

Annual Meeting Agenda Item - Size of Council

Our congregational constitution reads as follows:

C12:01 The voting membership of the Congregation Council shall consist of the pastor(s), the deacon(s), the officers of the congregation, and not fewer than 10 members of this congregation, one of whom may be a youth and one of whom may be a young adult....

Since Trinity's council elects its officers, rather than them being elected by the entire congregation, we have always interpreted this section to mean that the council consists of no less than 10 members plus the pastor. According to C11:01, the council appoints our treasurer, who has voice but not vote at council meetings.

Our current council is proposing that we **reduce the size of the council by two members**. We believe this will lead to council members being a more appropriate ratio of active members. We realize this means some council members may need to be liaisons to more than one team/committee, but we think that is a workable change.

So, if approved at the **annual meeting Jan. 30**, C12:01 will read: *The voting membership of the Congregation Council shall consist of the pastor(s), the deacon(s), the officers of the congregation, and not fewer than 8 members of this congregation, one of whom may be a youth and one of whom may be a young adult....*
