PASTOR

Friends in Christ,
I read [an article online](#) that encouraged congregations to not let the current moment pass by before taking some time to reflect on what we have learned during the last year (or two). Here's a share-out from meetings/gatherings during January, 2022 at Trinity:

Worship Altar Guild and Music

We've become adaptable
Things can be simpler
Communion adaptations have gone well
We are now ready to bring back some things

Gospel and Growth

We need repeated, frequent contact with God and our church family; that contact was maintained through online worship and Zoom classes; we pay closer attention to worship when we are here in person, so that makes us appreciate in-person worship even more. We have taken time to get better acquainted with each other and, seeing fewer people around to get things done, we feel a higher level of responsibility to do things. We appreciate how many people it takes to make things happen. The Advent Daily Devotion showed people are increasingly willing to be transparent and vulnerable in the stories they tell.

Stewardship

We have learned that this congregation has great generosity and faithfulness; we have weathered the loss of some core members and have gained new members; this has worked out better than we had anticipated; despite a long period without in-person worship in the sanctuary, giving has continued. Despite everything feeling off-balance initially, members have been resilient and adaptable. Liturgical worship surprisingly lends itself to online participatory worship experience; perhaps changing the liturgical setting several times each year helped prepare worshipers for having a "the same but different" worship experience online. If we pulled the tvprays.org devotions authored by Trinity members, we could gauge ways the church was addressing the pandemic.

PASTOR'S REPORT: Pr. Meggan Manlove

Joy: It was great to be together for Advent and Christmas Eve and we welcomed many guests. Mid-January has meant new member classes and lots of meetings. I am grateful for faithful team members showing up and dreaming about Lent/Easter and all things 2022.

Continuing Ed: I am participating online in Lake Institute's Certificate in Religious Fundraising.

Cluster: Five task groups are following up on our Cluster Planning Session Dec. 4 with these four actions: Formation of [cluster] Hub, Communications, Community Assessment, Community Engagement, and Training. We are at the early stages so not much is defined yet, but Alicia, our consultant, will work with us for the next six months.

GOSPEL AND GROWTH: Penelope Smith

held a planning meeting. We noted that 112 regular and 2 large print Advent Daily Devotional booklets were distributed. Add to this those who received the online version and those who listened to devotions read by Pastor Meggan; we had a large audience in 2021. In the planning stages are an Open Sanctuary event leading up to Lent. This will be held on Saturday, February 26th, from 3:00 - 5:00 pm. In March, we will host a coffee and hot crossed buns gathering. There are also plans for a spiritual spa-day after Easter and, of course, the annual church CampOut in Donnelly to be held June 24 - 26. We are also pondering a St Lucia Day event on December 13th.

STEWARDSHIP: Penelope Smith

will host an activity on January 23rd where Sunday School children learn about using their gifts and have opportunity to sign up to help out at Trinity. We will focus on "stewardship of our attention" in February, "stewardship of our property" in March, and "stewardship of hospitality" in April. We reviewed 2021 pledging and giving, and compared that with 2019 (the last year when we worshiped indoors in the sanctuary all

year). In 2021, we had more households that "met" their pledge, many that exceeded their pledges, and fewer that gave less than pledged; the net difference was a plus \$13,144. In addition, we also had households that did not pledge but gave, for a total of \$39,417. Considering the number of Sundays when our only option was to worship online and all that has factored into our current hybrid of in-person and online worship, we are grateful for the faithful financial support of Trinity and its ministries.



Church Campout The annual Trinity Lutheran Church CampOut is scheduled for the weekend of **June 24th - 26th.....early**

enough in the year that we hope to avoid extreme heat and green algae in Lake Cascade! No promises on summer downpours, though. (Ask Carl and Kristina Radke!!) But, statistically, the chances of that happening again in Idaho are pretty remote. Our hosts are Julie and Steve Ward. We use their several acre lot at Donnelly where there is sufficient room (and electricity) for many RVs and tents. Their one-room cabin (AKA "the shanty") serves as bathroom facilities for any in need. Feel free to arrive early, but our organized activities begin on Friday evening with a potluck ice cream social. Other group activities include Saturday's shared breakfast, happy hour with beverages and hors d'oeuvres, and dinner. After supper, we have worship around the campfire. Check out our YouTube video of the 2021 worship.....can you spot the doe who joined us? Beyond those group activities, there is plenty of time to "do your own thing". That might be swimming or boating on Lake Cascade, a trip to Gold Fork Hot Springs, or a visit to McCall, just a few miles to the north. Or you can hang out at camp, play games and become better acquainted with the amazing members or our intergenerational church family. We always have a few people who join us for just part of the event.....stopping by Saturday for Happy Hour, dinner and worship, for example. So, if you have your own place in Valley County, why not be there that weekend and stop by the campout. As we so often say "ALL ARE WELCOME".



Stewardship of Our

Attention - is the year-round-stewardship focus for February. Where are you directing the bulk

of your attention these days? Is it to the news or social media? Is it to streaming on television? Or are you just powering ahead, trying to avoid focus anything stimulating or unpleasant? This month we challenge you to be godly stewards of how you focus your attention. Each week we will ask you to consider things such as: 1) where do I notice and pay attention to God? 2) who is God asking me to pay attention to this week? 3) during my discretionary time, how does where I direct my attention align with my values? 4) how do I critically engage with media? Even just a slight shift-of-focus can be life-giving.

Monday Morning Study Group

Don't take anything for granted. We are able to learn new things like Zoom and technology can keep us connected from others near and far away. It's different, but one can created new relationships with people you have never met in person using technology. The importance of working highspeed internet for all households. We've become a church without walls and there are benefits to online church for real people. It was important to use hard copy/paper communication with people without internet. Consistently doing in-depth assessment of who is connected and who is in danger of falling through the cracks was crucial. The deep importance of feeling community-but that takes work-and we have been willing to do that work. Being isolated gives us time to be reflective; we're more capable of enduring isolation than we had imagined. Online giving is great and we hope it continues.

Church Council

The church of Jesus was not about brick-and-mortar 2000 years ago; being online and outdoors and doing many things differently feels more like being the church of Jesus. We have had to deal with changes, on almost a week-to-week basis, and have become more accepting of change because of this; we have adjusted well, despite our desire to have things be the way they used to be. We have become more open to the perspectives of others. We have a sense of just how long a year can feel. We have named what is hard and learned to celebrate what we have accomplished. We used the strengths we already had such as respect for others, dignity, and creativity. Our concept of what a healthy congregation should look like (full sanctuary; full offering plate) has been altered; we are healthier than preconceived notions indicate.

Trinity Lutheran Church College Scholarship Description and Application 2021 Graduates

The Trinity Lutheran Church College Scholarship is for graduating high school seniors who are active+ members of Trinity Lutheran Church in Nampa, Idaho. This scholarship must be used at a two-year or four-year accredited college or university or an accredited trade school within the academic year following their high school graduation. It is to be used for tuition, books or other education related fees. This scholarship is supported by the Trinity Lutheran Church (TLC) congregation and the TLC Youth Program. The monetary value* funded by TLC for this scholarship will total \$500. This will be given out or divided between one or more students recommended to the church council by the youth committee for final approval based on their Trinity Lutheran Church College Scholarship Application. Scholarship applications will be available to download on the TLC website- www.nampatrinity.org Applicants must complete the application form and return it to the church office before **February 15** of their graduating year. Criteria for award selection will be based on completed application and 2 letters of recommendation. Applicants will be notified by mail in April if they are to receive the award [whole or partial]. Recipients will be recognized at the High School Graduate Recognition Sunday in May.
