Dear Friends in Christ,

Spring may finally be here, as I write up this column! It is so good to see budding trees and daffodils and hear the birds—all signs of new life in the season in which we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus. Each Sunday between Easter and Pentecost we hear the unfolding story of the Easter Season and learn what it means to live as people who trust the resurrection. Towards the end of the season is Ascension Day, 40 days after Easter. One thing we have learned the last few years is that, when the weather permits, we do well to use our lawn and patio spaces; people who might not want to venture inside our building are quite happy to join us outside (think Pet Blessing, Longest Night, and other events). Join us Thursday, May 18 at 7pm for an Ascension Day Worship Service (think evening prayer) on the Patio followed by dessert. Pentecost Sunday, May 28, will include the story from Acts 2, hearing scripture read in multiple languages, and the celebration of the Holy Spirit and the birth of the church. Two milestone celebrations also happen in May. We will hold Graduate Recognition on May 7 and Kaiti Walton (our accompanist graduating from C of I) will sing a duet with a classmate. May 21 will be Affirmation of Baptism or Confirmation Sunday for our two ninth graders. Finally, our Treasure Valley Cluster will be blessed in May with a visit from Philorian Mpendaye, the General Secretary of the Ulanga Kilombero Diocese in Tanzania (see his bio inside the Epistle). Watch email and bulletins for news about a cluster gathering when we can all get to know Philorian and hear more about our companion synod. The month of May will be a season to celebrate new adventures, new relationships, and new life. Remember these words from 2 Corinthians: “16 From now on, therefore, we regard no one from a human point of view; even though we once knew Christ from a human point of view, we know him no longer in that way. 17 So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new!”

April's Noisy Offering on Sunday, April 30th will be for the 2C Relief Fund. The Idaho Immigrant Resource Alliance and Vision 2C Resource Council are doing what they can to mitigate the harms that heat exhaustion can cause farmworkers. PASTOR'S REPORT: Pr. Meggan Manlove

Cluster - Watch for the scheduling of an evening with our Companion Synod visitor sometime in May. I am excited for Trinity to host the Confirmation Co-op Dinner in May. Prayers for Redeemer, who has a candidate visiting in-person in early May. Grace, Mountain Home and Hope, Eagle have both completed their profiles.

Community - Very excited to host *How Stories Can Save Us* April 20. I have been back attending both Nampa Chamber and Idaho Hispanic Chamber events—great ways to connect with lots of people in the community. I'll be on a Yes in God's Backyard Panel at the Northwest Leadership Institute at Cathedral of the Rockies, Boise April 26.

Youth - We have a number of kids and a family registered for Luther Heights. Registration for Learning Peace opens May 1 with a big registration push coming the following week.

GOSPEL AND GROWTH: Penelope Smith

Met April 11th, discussing the Church CampOut June 23 - 25 at the Ward property in Donnelly. As a way to "serve our neighbor", following the devastating fire of 2022 that ruined all the books at the Cascade Public Library, we are organizing a collection of gently used books, to be donated in June. Other plans for the CampOut are underway. We are also encouraging everyone to attend the "Between the Listening and the Hearing" workshop on April 20th, a community event hosted at Trinity and focused on ways to have healing conversations with those who are hurting. We discussed plans for the 2023 Advent Daily Devotional booklet.

STEWARDSHIP: Penelope Smith

Met April 11th discussing the special giving drive, Idaho Gives, May 1 - 4th. Council would like to focus this fundraiser on seed money for the HVAC project. There will be matching gifts unlocked at various points during the event. The Stewardship for All Seasons meeting on April 17th will be about planned giving; all members of Stewardship and Endowment committees have been encouraged to attend. Outcomes of our Faith Formations Ministry Initiative will be celebrated during the next months. Planning for the Tough Conversations Ministry Initiative was done after church on April 16th. And we look ahead to another fun Food Trucks and Lawn Games event in June.

Saint Patrick's day dinner and game night: 28 people attended the dinner and most stayed for games. If we do another St. Patrick's Day dinner and provide the meat, we should use a different calculation for purchasing the meat. We had quite a bit of corned beef left, almost everybody took home a doggie bag. We have used up the hospitality budget for 2023. Next budget go around we should consider increasing our budget. The welcome bags and their contents come from the hospitality budget.

Easter brunch potluck. We had 55 people come for Easter brunch. On Saturday, the set up day, we had a lot of volunteers. There has been at one reported case of food poisoning. With our aging congregation we may want to think about only allowing purchased food to be served at fellowship events.

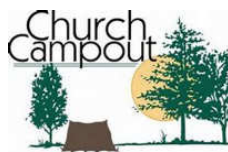


The **sign-up sheets** for Church Cleaning (east end of the Fellowship Hall), Fellowship Time (in the narthex).



DONATE YOUR USED BOOKS! - Those of us who have spent time in Cascade, Idaho, were saddened when the 2022 fire demolished the town's only pharmacy. It was a fun place to shop, and the loss of a local place to pick up prescriptions has been such a hardship on the residents. The public library is in the building adjacent to the pharmacy. Due to smoke and water damage, its contents were also a total loss. Trinity reached out to the library last spring, asking if they would like some donated books. At that point, they were still trying to figure out the clean-up. **BUT**, they saved our email, and contacted us this spring saying **YES**, they would love it if we would donate some used books in **good condition!**

From now until late June, we will have boxes in the narthex, ready to receive your donations of books. As they accumulate, we will transfer them to other boxes for storage (we already have 6 boxes ready to go!) During the week of Church CampOut, our campers will use their pickups and RVs to transport the books to Cascade. Book donation is a great way to do all kinds of things to love and help our neighbors while we clean out our own shelves and make room for even MORE book purchases of our own!




